Water Testing

In Week 6, we had a routine water testing failure. Two of our taps (one in the male adult toilet and one in the K-2 wet area - neither used for drinking) returned a negative purity test. The tanks have since been cleaned and the taps isolated. Bottled water has been used for drinking only as a precaution. We are waiting for another test to ensure that the taps are clean and we can use them again.


